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






FOR THE PAST 10 YEARS....




GOAL



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TCHMB PAST INITIATIVES



Maternal Early Warning System

Implement a protocol into practice to facilitate timely recognition, diagnosis, and treatment for pregnant women developing critical illness, thus preventing major morbidity and mortality. This initiative is an integral component of TexasAIM.



Increasing Breastfeeding And Human Milk Use In the NICU

15 hospitals with Level III & IV NICU participating, covering 800 NICU beds.



Reducing Failed Induction of Labor

3 hospitals are participating in the learning collaborative and are currently in the maintenance phase.



Postpartum Access To Healthcare (PATH)

Improve access to care during the critical postpartum period, and document the experiences of underserved women in central Texas. Document the landscape, the gaps, and the opportunities for increasing accessibility to doula care for underserved women in central Texas.



Increasing Access to Reproductive Healthcare

3 clinic systems are participating in the learning collaborative of One Key Question® protocol and are in maintenance phase



Reference Sheet on Public Healthcare Programs

This project aims to produce a concise reference sheet to empower frontline workers in assisting low-income, uninsured women in Texas who may qualify for the main public healthcare coverage programs.


Provide guidance for initial assessment and to support normothermia with minimal interventions for all infants at birth.



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
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
NEWBORN ADMISSION TEMPERATURE PROJECT





DATA DRIVEN (NAT DASHBOARD JULY '21-SEP '22)










WE AIM TO STRENGTHEN OUR QI REACH THROUGH:


1. ENGAGEMENT

Engaging hospitals with disproportionately affected populations



2. EXPANSION

Expanding the number of stakeholders and Community Organizations on projects









COMPREHENSIVE DATA SYSTEM TO INFORM AND SUPPORT QI

- Provide the essential data to prioritize QI initiatives
- Share data back confidentially to hospitals to support their QI efforts
- Facilitate performance comparisons with other hospitals, with other regions, and across the state
- Allow identification and monitoring of health care disparities in Texas
- Allow hospitals to view their performance, identify additional areas for improvement, and develop/share strategies
- Provide secure physical, administrative, and technical safeguards for data







ELIMINATE DISPARITIES

- Incorporating strategies to address health equity (race, ethnicity, language, geography, and insurance coverage)
- Incorporating respectful, patient centered care into all training and QI projects
- Incorporating strategies to address health-related social needs
- Assure that all projects incorporate patients and families in the planning and implementation
