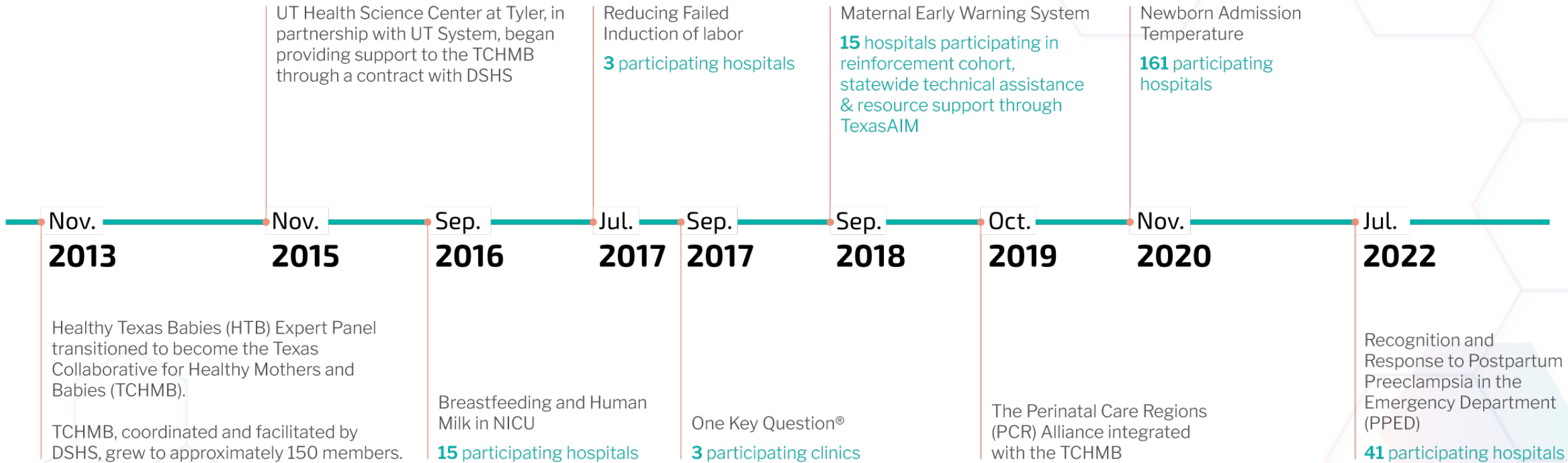

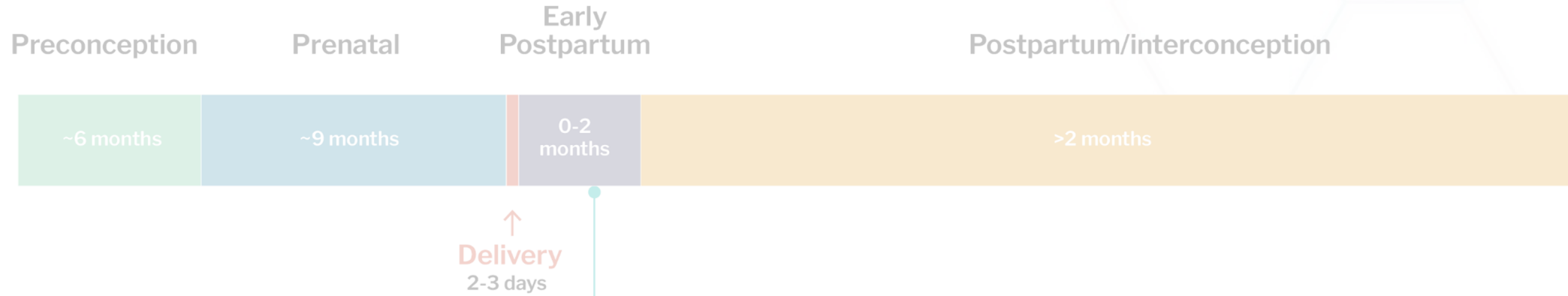

### Maternal Early Warning System

Implement a protocol into practice to facilitate timely recognition, diagnosis, and treatment for pregnant women developing critical illness, thus preventing major morbidity and mortality. This initiative is an integral component of TexasAIM.



### Recognition and Response to Postpartum Preeclampsia in the Emergency Department

This project seeks to help coordinate emergency care for postpartum patients experiencing signs and symptoms of postpartum preeclampsia.



### Reducing Failed Induction of Labor

3 hospitals are participating in the learning collaborative and are currently in the maintenance phase.



### Increasing Access to Reproductive Healthcare

3 clinic systems are participating in the learning collaborative of One Key Question® protocol and are in maintenance phase
