




PRETERM BIRTH IN THE STATE OF TEXAS

Texas's preterm birth rate in 2017 rose from 10.4 to 10.6 percent and the state overall received a "**D**" grade.

Many of the cities in Texas received a "C" or "D" grade, with Austin receiving a 9.3 "C" grade and San Antonio receiving an 11.9 "F" grade.





LAUNCH OF GREATER HOUSTON BIRTH EQUITY INITIATIVE

March of Dimes was able to take the lead in launching this initiative to advance birth equity and forge a path toward change across communities and systems.
