Some doulas are former recipients of services



- "A paraprofessional who occupies the gap between the expert professionals in the health and human service systems and the families whose life experiences keep them distant from resources and slow to trust."
- "The community-based doula understands community context, interpreting across cultural divides, and plays a bridging role in helping families access important services and act on behalf of their own health."








Healthcare's Organizational Assets











MCO-Funded Doula Quality Improvement Project








Initial conversations



 - 100% eligible certified nurses




